

CHAPTER VIII. OVERVIEW OF EMERGENCY-DEPARTMENT DATA AND CHARGES

This section of the report provides detailed information collected about visits to emergency departments (EDs) in Wisconsin hospitals.

Facilities that Reported Data

Data were collected from 125 hospitals on ED visits between January 1, 2010, and December 31, 2010. Most (124) of these hospitals are general medical-surgical hospitals. Please refer to Appendix 4 for all opening, closings, and mergers as they relate to facilities that submitted data in 2010.

The ED visits summarized in this report are those in which patients came to the ED, received evaluation and/or treatment, and were discharged from the ED. Excluded from this analysis are cases in which the patient was admitted as an inpatient from the ED or were held over for observation. Also excluded are those in which the patient underwent an ambulatory surgery procedure (such cases are reported in Chapter VI)

Wisconsin hospitals reported a total of 1,615,401 ED visits in 2010.

How to Read the Tables

Tables 32 through 43 summarize the volume and types of ED visits in Wisconsin in 2010.

Table 32 presents the number and rate of Wisconsin ED visits by patient age and sex:

- Nineteen percent of all ED visits involved a child less than 15 years old.
- Fifty-five percent of all ED visits involved female patients.
- Females aged 20 - 24 had the highest visit rates among all age/sex categories, at 54 per 100 population.

Table 33 examines the number and percentage of Wisconsin ED visits by type of primary diagnosis, by age and sex:

- Twenty-five percent of all ED visits were related to injury and poisoning diagnoses.
- Fifty-four percent of ED visits related to injury and poisoning involved male patients.

Table 34 presents the number and percentage of the most frequently reported primary diagnoses by age group:

- Thirty-five percent of all Pneumonia ED primary diagnoses were for children under age 15.
- Twenty-three percent of all Abdominal pain ED primary diagnoses were for patients aged 15 – 24.
- Sixty-seven percent of all Chest pain ED primary diagnoses were for patients aged 25 – 64.
- Sixty-six percent of all Cerebrovascular disease ED primary diagnoses were for patients aged 65 and older.

Tables 35 through 40 present greater detail about the number and percentage distribution for the most frequently reported primary diagnoses for each age group, by sex.

Tables 41 and 42 present the number and percentage of injury-related ED visits by external cause of injury (E-code) statewide and by age group. Table 41 indicates that the most common types of injury treated in Wisconsin emergency departments in 2010 were those relating to falls. Fall-related injuries accounted for thirty percent of all the injury cases, at a rate of 2,287 per 100,000 population.

Table 42 shows the breakdown of ED visits by age. Falls were the most common injury-related diagnosis among Wisconsin ED visits in 2010 for children under 15, and for adults aged 25 and older. Among patients 15 – 24, the largest number of injury-related visits fell into the category of “striking/struck by.”

Table 43 lists the Wisconsin hospitals that reported ED visits for 2010 and the number of visits at each hospital. Not all hospitals operate emergency departments.

Caveats/Data Limitations For Emergency-Department Data

1. Percentages are rounded to whole numbers.
2. Diagnoses were categorized according to the International Classification of Diseases, 9th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-9-CM). The Supplementary Classification category encompasses factors other than disease or injury, such as observation for a condition that was not found, removing sutures, and blood tests for alcohol or other drugs.
3. Most primary diagnosis groups used in this report were defined by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The leading diagnoses for the United States appear in the CDC publication *National Hospital Ambulatory Medical Care Survey: 2008 Emergency Department Summary Tables*. 4. E-code groups were categorized utilizing the methodology outlined in Appendix 2 – Methodology and Technical Notes. Visits were only considered to be injury or poisoning related if an E-code (E800 through E999) was reported and at least one of the reported diagnoses was for injury or poisoning.
5. The visit rate is the number of visits per 100 or 100,000 population. The rate was calculated by dividing the total number of visits in a particular age, sex, or diagnosis category by the U.S. Census Bureau's December 21, 2010 population figures for that age, sex, analysis area or statewide total, then multiplying the result by 100, or 100,000, as applicable.
6. Records were considered to be ED records for purposes of this report if
 - (a) they contained a revenue code in the 0450-0459 range, excluding 0456
 - (b) the patient was not admitted as an inpatient at the facility providing ED care
 - (c) the patient did not undergo an ambulatory surgery procedure
 - (d) The patient was not held over for observation.
