Black Box Users

"NEW" Version 2.0 coming soon

Black Box Users * Please READ!

Effective April 10, 2018 the current black box will no longer be supported. All current black box users must download and install the new version of the .NET Framework, Version 4.5 or higher. The new black box will be available for download on March 20, 2018 – http://whainfocenter.com/whaic 837 handler.zip

As WHAIC continues to tighten its security to protect the data submitted, hospitals and ASCs that use our black box program to calculate the unique case ID value and remove the patient names and/or upload their data directly to WIpop using the black box program from their 837 files <u>must act on this message</u>.

The black box was originally written using the .NET Framework 4.0, for maximum compatibility. However, 4.0 does not support the modern protocol for encrypted communications. Therefore, the black box is being updated to use what is called the .NET 4.5 Framework. You will need to download and install this update, which is being designated version 2.0 for all data submitted in Q1 2018.

The new program, version 2.0, does not have any functionality changes and will operate the same as the current black box. **Data Submitters** <u>may need to contact their IT or tech support to download and install the new version</u> of the black box.

837 Claim File Conversion Project!

Q118 – first quarter to report using 837 claims file format

We finally made it! All discharge data with dates of service that fall in Q118 must be submitted using the 837 claims file format. There are three major points to address before the close of quarter one:

- There are no changes to the data submission dates as outlined in the current calendar. To print or download the 2018 data submission calendar go to the <u>WHA Information Center</u>, Data Submitters / WIpop Compliance & IC Updates for a copy of the <u>2018 Data Submission Calendar</u>.
- 2) We will continue to reach out to the CEO or other senior leadership of any facility that has not completed testing in the 837 format throughout the month of March. Not having a complete, fully tested file is cause for serious concern in addition to putting the facility at risk of being out of compliance to submit state mandated discharge data. If your site does not have access to upload a file for 2018, a red notice informing you that you do not have permission to submit for the quarter will appear. Files must meet a certain amount of criteria in order to pass to production.
 - Delaying 837 claims file testing causes hardship for your facility as well as WHAIC staff.
- 3) In May and June we will be reviewing and rolling out changes to the file downloads and validation reports. We encourage you to maintain a hard copy or electronic copy of your last few quarters of validation reports to use as reference when comparing historical data during your validation review. This will provide the necessary resources to evaluate any major shifts in the current data versus what was historically reported.

WHAIC Website changes to support 837 Implementation

As a reminder, the current WIpop Data Submission Manual will be replaced with the new WIpop 837 Companion Guide and Technical Specifications.

In addition to the new Black Box version 2.0, there have been a number of updates and clarification made to the WIpop 837 Data Submission Manual.

*In the Payer Mapping Table – REMOVE: Transplant Network, Organ Procurement, Donation and Transplantation We could not support this option as an actual payer type, and as a result we do not have a payer class to map this to for the data sets.

All Wipop users, data submitters and editors should consult the online Wipop manual prior to reaching out to WHAIC staff. While we make every effort to respond to all calls and emails in a timely manner, we have very limited resources. The online manual has a tremendous amount of information and should be utilized often.
