Ann Zenk, RN, BSN, MHA, WHA Vice President of Workforce and Clinical Practice, has been in consistent contact with the C-Suite executives to provide regular updates on the Coronavirus – COVID-19 and the efforts being made by WHA to keep hospitals abreast of the changing situation. In addition to the communications outlining WHA's efforts to provide timely information, Zenk also provided details on how the FDA, CDC and DHS are handling the situation and their strategies for offering guidance to health care providers.

On the National level, on February 27, 2020, CMS.gov posted a new mlnconnects, the official CMS news from the Medicare Learning Network, that included coding guidance on COVID-19. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for Health Statistics will implement a new ICD-10-CM diagnosis code for the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19), effective with the next update on October 1. WIpop News!

Hospital Services:

This notice is intended for hospitals that own and submit claims for ALL hospital services in off-campus (sister/parent) hospitals that are **not separately licensed and share the same Medicare number** as the main hospital.

Purpose: This policy has been established to ensure accuracy and consistency of reporting for all discharge data collected from off-campus hospitals and outpatient facilities that share the same Medicare number as the main hospital.



Inpatient and outpatient data are available for a wide range of uses including, but not limited to, research, publications, commercial health care operations, understanding market trends/market share analysis, policy decision making, and other consumer care purposes.

Policy Statement: In order to provide an all-encompassing representation of the discharge data, WHAIC requires all hospitals to report inpatient and outpatient hospital services, performed in off-campus locations with an assigned service facility location identifier / provider-based identifier.

The value of the data increases when the user understands the type of services rendered **and the service facility location** in which those services were obtained.

Additional communications will be forthcoming to hospitals with further instructions and details.

Payers:

As with most fields on the 837 claims file format, our expectation is that the details in WIpop match the details from the actual claim. Since the implementation of the 837 claims file format, the reporting of payers has consistently improved. However, some facilities have continued to pre-map, autofill or randomly assign payers to the encounters, which diminishes its purpose and value.

There are a few ways to review and validate the data after you submit and/or while correcting edits.

1) Verify your data using the online real-time reports in WIpop such as the Inventory Report.

<u>Inventory Report:</u> Identifies by data type - <u>place of service, payer codes, patient control number, etc.</u> on each line item.

To review the record(s):

- 1) In WIpop in the upper right corner, click on the "Batch/Reports".
- 2) Confirm the batch file is open, otherwise the records will be in a read-only status.
- 3. Go to "Find Patient Record".
- 3) Enter in the patient control number (pcontrol) provided on the report.
- 4) Make corrections as needed.
- 5) Once your changes are made, mark the batch file complete.
- 2) If a payer name is provided, it will be stored on the back end of the WIpop database. Ideally, the submitter will use this information to update unknown payers during the validation period or throughout the submission process.

New Edit coming in 2020!

Type of Bill Codes are Required in Wlpop. Type of bill (TOB) codes are published in the UB-04 National Uniform Billing Committee guidelines (NUBC). As with most fields on the 837 claims file format, these codes should come directly from the claim that is sent to the payer.

TOB is a four-digit field on the institutional paper claim and in WIpop, but a three-digit field on the EDI 837 Claims File. WHAIC requires a leading zero but will accept the 3-digit code as provided on the 837 claims file format and assign a leading zero in WIpop.

The TOB gives three specific pieces of information after a leading zero. The first digit identifies the type of facility. The second digit classifies the type of care. The third digit indicates the sequence of the bill in any episode of care. It is referred to as a "frequency" code.

In 2019, several field audits led us to discover several facilities auto filling fields or remapping the field to a specific code unrelated to the type of encounter. As a result, a new edit has been defined that helps our efforts to follow correct coding and billing guidelines whenever possible. As previously explained in November, effective with Q2 2020, a new edit will be implemented that checks the type of bill against the type of encounter/record.

Edits applicable to TOB:

1160	Type of Bill is a required field.

^{*}ASCs are not required to report type of bill; however, this field is required in WIpop per state statute. WHAIC has asked facilities to map the data to 0999 or 0831 or a version of this. Under certain circumstances as defined in the manual, WHAIC will automatically assign an acceptable TOB to this field in WIpop – see the 837P specification for more information.
